It's also a good time for parents to rethink their relationships with troubled children. Parents have a tough time competing with LGBTQ indoctrination and pressure, which seems to be everywhere.

God intimately knows each of us even before we are born:



Personal Recovery

I had been raised in the church but felt abandoned. Later, as other people were telling me that God loves me like a Father, I had a hard time grasping that. Men could not be trusted. When I fell deep into the pit of despair, I finally called out to God. I found Him to be the ultimate gentleman. He was truly able to fix my broken heart. The root of my identity crisis was exposed; I had been rejected and abused—and then healed.

Some of the fruits of rejection are bitterness, shame, striving, unforgiveness, broken relationships, victimization, wrongful identity, legalism and blaming others.

Thankfully, the Lord placed people in my path with the courage to share truth, love and the Gospel of Jesus Christ. When God exposes something, He does it to facilitate lasting freedom. For genuine healing and transformation to occur in the hearts of our family and friends, we need to continue to pray for the roots of their wrongful identities to be revealed.

Pray that love of Christ will reach the heart of the lost. **Pray** for yourself as a parent or other family member, that you will draw close to God and so will your loved one.

Pray for the Church to speak truth in love and walk alongside prodigals as they return to Jesus.

Perhaps you, as a parent, can speak some of this truth about God's great love into the life of your child and help restore his or her true identity.
